



FIRST AMERICAN CHURCH TO BE BUILT ON OKINAWA AFTER THE INVASION ON 1 APRIL 1945






The 854th ENGINEER BATTALION was constituted 14 December 1942 in the Army of the United States as the 854th Engineer Aviation Battalion and activated 1 January 1943 at March Field, California. Departed the San Francisco Port of Embarkation 1 December 1943 and arrived in the Territory of Hawaii on 11 December 1943. Moved to Kwajalein on 2 February 1944, to Guam on 7 October 1944, to le Shima Island on 24 June 1945 and Okinawa 25 June 1945 and assumed duties in the Army of Occupation. The Battalion was on Okinawa at the end of World War II (15 August 1945 location). Inactivated 15 March 1946 on Okinawa.

While some accounts of the building of the Church of Peace say it was done under fire, the battalion did not reach Okinawa until 25 June 1945 per the above information, and the Japanese on Okinawa surrendered on 21 June 1945.




